Archery at the Hill

1976 was a very memorable year for me. Not only did our great country celebrate its bicentennial, but two things happened to me that developed into lifelong activities. 1976 was the year I first picked up a bow and the first year I ever put on a Scout uniform. Twenty-nine years later, I still find great joy in Scouting and in archery, and every once in a while, I get to combine these two great loves. One of these occasions was at the 2005 National Boy Scout Jamboree held July 25th through August 3rd at Fort A.P. Hill, Virginia. This was the third time I had the honor of being on staff at the Jamboree, and the second time being on the archery staff. I had the distinct pleasure of serving with the archery staff in action center "A," which was located near the Scouts from the Southern Region. There were also equally dedicated archery staffs serving the other three regions and action centers. In all, we numbered 140 archery staffers to bring alive this great sport to the over 43,000 in attendance.

In addition to archery, each action center kept the Scouts busy with activities such as pioneering, trapshooting, air rifles, bmx motocross, rappelling, buckskin games, and the confidence course. The Scouts also kept busy during the ten day event with other activities such as canoeing, kayaking, scuba, fishing, snorkeling, and rafting. There was also plenty of opportunities for the Scouts to learn through activities ranging from disability awareness to arts and sciences. And, of course, the Jamboree was full of activities put on by every branch of our Armed Forces, including numerous bands and drill teams, as well as the ever popular Army Action Center.

Before the troops rolled in, the archery staff was tasked to put together a safe and fun archery range. In no time, we had a sharp looking range that included an area for the required safety talk, a lookout tower, and a safe and secure 10 yard range that would accommodate 40 shooters at a time.

The preparations for the Jamboree also included an extensive safety and shooting orientation for the staff. Those who were not already certified were given the opportunity to earn their NAA level 1 certification. This year's Jamboree was also the first time we had the opportunity to use Genesis bows. Brennan Industries President Kevin Stay was on hand to give the staff some pointers on the care and maintenance of the Genesis bow. In addition, Kevin made arrangements for Mathews pro shooters Richard Leftwich, Mel Shrewsbury, Roger Willet, and Scott Price to make appearances during the Jamboree to thrill the Scouts with their shooting skills.

In all, the Jamboree saw 46,865 ends shot for a total of 234,325 arrows. This large number, however, pails with the number of smiles seen throughout this extraordinary event. The National Boy Scout Jamboree is normally held every

four years. However, the next one will happen in five years to correspond with the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Boy Scouts of America. I've already made my plans, and am sure 2010 will be another landmark year.
