

Two major indoor events, three chances of victory!

The Indoor World Archery Challenge 2010 is born! The archers in recurve, compound men and women who will participate in both the Tournaments of Nimes and Las Vegas 2010 will be able to qualify to this new world class event that will take place in Las Vegas on 20 February 2010.

The Indoor World Archery Challenge 2010 will assemble the first eight archers per category in recurve, compound men and women; that is a total of 32 archers. They will qualify based on their performances at the Tournaments of Nimes and Las Vegas.

A combined ranking will be established based on the results of the Tournament of Nimes and the results after the 60 arrows shot on Friday and Saturday at the Tournament of Las Vegas. This combined ranking will only include the archers taking part in **both** Tournaments (mandatory rule).

The Indoor Challenge will be held in the form of quarterfinals, semifinals and finals matches shot on Saturday 20 February 2010 according to the FITA rules for international indoor archery (exception for arrows diameter). With a total value of more than 15,000 USD (on top of the usual awards offered by both tournaments), an attractive prize-money will be awarded across the four divisions.

INDOOR WORLD ARCHERY CHALLENGE 2010 - RULES

1. Scope and Eligible Participants

This new world class event is **open to** the archers of the four indoor international divisions (Recurve Men, Recurve Women, Compound Men, Compound Women) **taking part in BOTH the Tournament of Nimes and the Tournament of Las Vegas in Championship Divisions (mandatory condition).**

The Indoor World Archery Challenge 2010 will take place on Saturday, 20 February 2010 as of 6 pm in Las Vegas in the form of quarterfinals, semifinals and finals according to the FITA rules for Indoor Archery (except for the arrow diameter for which the Vegas rules will apply). The event is jointly organized by the Nimes and Las Vegas organizers.

2. Qualifying Ranking

A combined ranking will be established based on the results of the Tournament of Nimes and the results after the first 60 arrows shot on Friday and Saturday at the Tournament of Las Vegas. This combined ranking will only include the archers taking part in both Tournaments in each of the four international divisions:

- In the Tournament of Nimes (22, 24 and 24 January 2010), the archers will be ranked according to their final classification (based on Nimes rules).
- In the Tournament of Las Vegas (19, 20 and 21 February), the archers will be ranked according to their classification at the conclusion of the 30 arrows shot on Friday and the 30 arrows shot on Saturday (based on Las Vegas rules).

Only the archers who compete both in Nimes and Las Vegas will be

Awards in each of the four divisions:

- 1st place: 2000.- US \$
- 2nd place: 1000.- US \$
- 3rd place: 750.- US \$
- The no. 1 qualifier : + free registration for the Tournaments of Nimes and Las Vegas 2011 as well as four free hotel nights at both of the tournaments in 2011.
