1. **The FAA Board of Directors met at 2:25 PM at the 2007 Target Championship on Saturday afternoon at Central Winds Park in Winter Springs. Members present: President - Bob Jones, Sec/Treas - Tim Austin, NFAA Dir & NW V/P – Oliver Austin, North V/P Sean Cahill, NAA Rep - Shelly Mascaro, and Release Editor, Shannon North. Members absent: Central V/P – Jake Pettitt, and South V/P John Laudicina.**
2. **The Minutes of the March board meeting were approved unanimously as printed. CLOSED**
3. **The treasurer's report was accepted unanimously. CLOSED**
4. **SHOOTER OF YEAR PROGRAM: The committee to study the Shooter of the Year program for possible changes to improve the program. Jake - Diane Watson – Tim. Tabled until next meeting. OPEN**
5. **RELEASE DISSEMINATION: SECOND READING. Article VIII, Par 13.a. Add at the end of the last paragraph: “unless that individual has elected to forgo the hard copy and view it on the FAA Web Site.” So voted. CLOSED. – FAA Secretary to email the FAA Membership to see who does not want a hard copy mailed to them. OPEN**
6. **RELEASE ON WEB: Article VIII, Par 12. h. South moved to add: “The word document file for the Release will be sent to the FAA Webmaster to be placed on the web site at the same time it is sent to the printer for publication.” Northwest seconded. So voted. OPEN FOR SECOND READING**
7. **GUEST DEFINITION: SECOND READING. Article XV, Par 3. Remove “The scores of out of state non-resident archers are to be reported separately and they shall compete against each other in separate divisions.” Add Par 7. “Guest are welcome at FAA Championships. Guest will pay full registration fees. Guests will shoot for no award. A guest is defined as an out of state NFAA or NAA archer, an out of country IFAA or FITA archer, or a NAA member in Florida who has not joined the Florida Archery Association.” Moved by Northwest. Seconded by North. So voted. CLOSED**

8. **FAA BOARD MEETINGS: SECOND READING** Secretary moved to replace Article VII, par 3 “Meetings...at Indoor, International, Field, and Target” with: “Meetings will be held at four major events acceptable to the board members and spaced through the year and selected by the Board at the State Scheduling Meeting which will be held at the State Field Championship.” So voted. **CLOSED**
9. **INDOOR TIE SCORE BREAKERS:** Article XVIII, Par 1 m. President moved and Secretary seconded: “Where multiple indoor sites are used for an FAA Indoor Championship, both x counts and inside-out x counts will be kept. The inside-out x count will be used to break ties in score. (normal x’s are part of the score) An inside-out x is defined as an arrow inside the x ring that does not touch the x ring dividing line. On the score card, inside-out x’s will be denoted by circling the x on the score card. Where two archers have the same total and x count and inside-out x count, they will be considered tied and duplicate awards will be presented. So voted. **OPEN FOR SECOND READING.**
10. **2008 INDOOR TIE BREAKERS:** Northwest moved to use the above system for the 2008 Indoor Championships. President seconded. So voted. **CLOSED**
11. **OFFICER FREE SHOOTING:** Northwest moved and South (by email) seconded that FAA Board Members will shoot free at four state shoots of their choosing each year. Northwest, South, and Central vote yes. North, President, Secretary, and NAA Rep vote no. Motion failed. **CLOSED**
12. **FAA MONEY SHOOT:** Northwest moved and Secretary seconded: Article XVII, Par 10 e. “For 1-5 individuals there shall be only 1 flight. For 6-10 individuals there shall be two flights. For 11 or more individuals there shall be three flights.” So voted. **OPEN FOR SECOND READING**
13. **TARGET CHAMPIONSHIP MAKEUP:** North moved and NAA Rep seconded: to change the FAA Target Championship from two 900 rounds to a 900 round on Saturday and a Classic 600 round on Sunday. (Note: classic 600 round is 4 ends of 5 arrows at each distance shot at an NFAA 92cm face shooting from the short distance to the long distance.) So voted **OPEN FOR SECOND READING**

Hunters oppose Green Swamp hog trapping

Some Green Swamp Wildlife Management Area (WMA) hunters are up in arms over a land management decision to trap an unknown number of feral hogs off the property prior to the start of the 2007 hunting season.

In a series of letters and emails to several state agencies and the Governor's office, Florida Archery Association (FAA) Release Editor and State Bowhunting Committee Representative Shannon K. North alleges that hogs are being "stolen" from hunters by trappers allowed to take hundreds of the animals prior to the opening of archery season.

"These trappers are stealing the hunter's game, which they pay for by buying licenses, management stamps, archery permits, etc. Why did they have to trap just before archery season? The results of this injustice showed this weekend at Green Swamp. Approximately 500 hunters and only one hog taken," North said.

The Southwest Florida Water Management District (District) purchased approximately 110,000 acres in the Green Swamp to keep the land and water resources protected for future generations.

This area is known as the Green Swamp Wilderness Preserve. The Preserve is divided into three management units: Green Swamp East (67,670 acres), Green Swamp West (37,350 acres) and Little Withlacoochee Flood Detention Area (4,446 acres). When combined with the 63,522 acres of adjoining publicly owned land, there are about 172,988 acres of the Green Swamp under public ownership. Green Swamp WMA (or Green Swamp East) consists of nearly 50,000 acres in Lake, Polk, and Sumter counties.

While the property is a part of the state's public WMA hunting land system managed by the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC), SWFWMD is the lead manager of the property and has the discretion to utilize a variety of land management techniques, including trapping of the wild hog population.

Wild hogs occur throughout Florida in various habitats, but prefer moist forests and swamps and pine flatwoods. Hogs feed by rooting with their broad snouts and can cause great damage to property, sometimes leaving an area looking like a plowed field.

SWFWMD's Green Swamp WMA website states, "Exotic animals, too, can upset the natural balance in this fragile environment. Feral hogs, introduced centuries ago by Spanish explorers, have damaged entire forests and pasturelands within the Green Swamp Wilderness Preserve, and continue to pose a threat to the area's ecosystem."

In a response to North's inquiry, SWFWMD Land Manager Kevin W. Love states, "The District's primary mission in the management of conservation lands under its stewardship is to manage the water and related natural resources to ensure their continued availability while maximizing environmental, economic and recreational benefits. An important part of protecting these resources is the control of invasive exotic plants and animals.

"The destructive potential of feral hogs on native wildlife and habitats is well documented and the feral hog is recognized as an invasive exotic animal. Therefore, the District's policy in the management of feral hogs is to maintain their numbers at the lowest possible levels. This position is widely shared by the other conservation land managers in Florida and the conservation community in general," Love wrote. "To illustrate, the FWC's Wildlife Legacy Plan, under the section heading Multiple Habitat Threats and Conservation Actions (p. 436) recommends: 'Create hog management plans for all managed conservation lands that have a goal of zero hogs unless they are needed as prey species for semi-dependant species like Florida panthers. Coordinate and integrate all plans among agencies.'

"The District manages all invasive exotic species on the 330,000 acres of conservation lands under its stewardship according to this principle," Love adds.

"The District makes available over 140,000 acres of its lands for hunting as WMAs in cooperation with the FWC. Hunting regulations for Green Swamp WMA, and all its WMAs, include feral hogs as legal to take, with no size or bag limits, as a dual means of providing a control on feral hog populations and a source of sport and recreation for Florida sports men and women," Love says.

"The Green Swamp WMA hog hunt has resulted in an annual average of 285 hogs harvested per year during the period 2000-2006. With the large size of the area and high productivity of the habitat for feral hogs, this harvest rate has proven insufficient in achieving the District's goal of managing the population at minimum levels, much less the Wildlife Legacy Plan's guideline of "zero" population," Love adds. "In fact, in recent years the number of hogs and severity of hog-related habitat disturbance observed by land managers in the Green Swamp WMA is among the most severe of any District land.

"The District contracts with feral hog trappers as an alternative means to control feral hog numbers on its conservation lands; both on non-hunted lands and as a supplemental means of control on WMAs," Love says.

"While maintenance of feral hog numbers at or near 'zero' is the District's goal as well as the goal of Florida's Wildlife Legacy Plan, we understand that this goal, while appropriate, is currently not attainable in Florida. We are confident that supplemental feral hog trapping is not in conflict with, nor does it impact the quality hunting experience on the Green Swamp WMA," Love concludes.

In a response, North states that the supplemental hog trapping has a direct impact on the quality of hunting experience on Green Swamp WMA for all hunters and asks why hunters were not notified prior to the hunting season that hogs were trapped out of the area.

"Your organization has done an injustice to the hunters of this state. They have spent their time and money for the recreational use of this public land with no recourse but to take this matter to higher authorities," North states.

"I assure you that all hunters in this great state of Florida will be made aware of the "Wildlife Legacy Plan" to destroy all feral hogs on management areas to extinction with monies that hunters contribute for their privilege to hunt," North responded.

In a reply to North's additional questions, Love stated that hog trappers are not paid a fee to perform the trapping, but are compensated by being allowed to keep the hogs trapped and sell them to a state-licensed quarantine and slaughter facility.

"The (SWFWMD) District conducts a wide array of management tactics on the conservation lands under its stewardship. While it is impractical to inform every user group of every specific management activity planned or taking place, we do coordinate closely with the FWC on all management activities that take place on our WMAs," Love wrote to North.

"I believe the hunters of Florida are getting the short end of the stick on management areas run by SWFWMD," North said. "The quality of these hunts have apparently suffered due to their management style, costing Florida hunters money and wasted time in hunting these areas."

"As you can see, the Governor's office passed the buck to SWFWMD to respond to this manner. SWFWMD's response indicates that their goal is a 'zero population' of hogs. It's all politics, and no one is being held accountable. The Governor's office doesn't want to respond, SWFWMD runs the management area and the FWC has no teeth in the matter," North said.

"The trapper is the one making out on this 'no fee' contract with SWIFTMUD. If he gets \$100 per hog, he has made approximately \$40,000 this year trapping hogs in Green Swamp. These are hogs which the hunters should be allowed to take.

Love nor FWC Public Hunting Areas Biologist Jason Burton could verify how many hogs were trapped off of Green Swamp WMA property this year prior to hunting season, according to North. **Woods 'N Water** attempted to contact Love and Burton via email, but did not receive a reply.

However, one disabled Green Swamp hunter contacted **Woods 'N Water** to complain that after the first week of hunting on the property he had not seen any hogs where he has historically observed many. The hunter stated that he monitored the WMA check-in station and confirmed North's claim that only one hog was checked out by hunters.

Among a long list of major proposed rule changes unveiled by the FWC in September is a proposal that harvest restrictions concerning wild hogs on WMAs be streamlined to eliminate confusing and contradictory rules that vary from one WMA to another.

Currently, wild hogs are managed as game animals on some WMAs and as feral hogs on others. The new rule proposals would allow wild hogs to be taken during any season open for taking game mammals, unless prohibited by specific area rule.

These changes would standardize and simplify FWC regulations regarding the take of wild hogs on public lands.

The FWC is expected to hear public comment on the proposed rule changes at its December, 2007 meeting.

EVERGLADES OPEN – 8-9 December 2007

Target number 19 in Homestead has shooting stakes on a gentle down slope and you shoot from a sheltered position at a target standing on a south to north point of land 60 yards away in the middle of the lake (that contains fish, of course) that is accessed by a bridge from the north bank. The lake is surrounded by large trees that include a very large tropical tree on the Southeast edge. – That's one of the favorite hangouts of the "Daddy" Iguana... about four and a half feet (rough estimate) from nose to end of long tail and mottled/striped orange and gray. He's the fellow pictured at the top of the Everglades registration form, and he's impressive. He's most often visible from that target butt, but most shoot and continue on without knowing he's there.

Everglades Archers did it again... provided us with a marvelous venue and excellent food for a warm, sunny weekend in South Florida on their yearly second December weekend major event. The temperature got up to 84 degrees on Saturday and the range is set up for shooting four across (especially since Katrina) so the competition flowed smoothly through the 28 target course. Plenty of cold water around the range kept us all hydrated, and no one mistakenly shot the reflected image of the target at 80 yards and at 50 yards over the lake. A nice Florida touch was two (McKenzie) alligators sunning themselves on the banks between the archers and the targets. Top score for the tournament was Pro competitor Chris Deston's 554 Hunter Round. The 14 target Animal Round top score was posted by Gilberto Ruiz from the host club with a 289.

Good eats both days... and I especially liked the venison burger that greeted me when I finished shooting on Sunday. We start at dawn (talk at 7:30 and shoot at 8:00 AM) because it's winter and the days are short, and this gets us started in the early morning comfortable hours. In previous year's NAFAC tournaments, this allowed the over-full range to complete about an hour before dusk. – With lighter registration this year and a shorter Animal Round, we were off the range early on Saturday and at lunch time on Sunday. Shelly Mascaro, Everglades Secretary/Treasurer, had made special primitive arrows with gold, silver, and bronze cresting and burned in "2007 Everglades Open" for a special, different type of award.

This tournament will return as a NAFAC in 2008. Y'all come!
